Over the past few months, we have been fortunate enough to borrow a Microscope kit from the Royal Microscopical Society. All years groups have been using the microscopes to enhance their learning in Science.

Key Stage 2 took part in a Science Club on Tuesday lunchtimes. During this time, we have been using the microscopes to view samples of natural and man made materials. We have observed materials that dissolve and don't dissolve in water. We have also looked at fruits and things that we can find in nature.



Children have enjoyed using the microscope kit during Science lessons to support their learning of the Working Scientifically skills. They have looked at objects, predicted what objects might look like through the microscope and drawn what they can see through the microscope.
