Keeping children safe

The safety of children at Hayward's is of paramount importance to us. We are committed to ensuring that all members of our school community will thrive in a safe and happy learning environment. Hayward's has a designated child protection officer (Mrs Ruth Dixon) and a deputy (Mr Andy Smith). They are both fully trained in current child protection practices and are responsible for child protection throughout the school.

Our school environment is regularly monitored to ensure the right balance between managed risk and safety. Through our PSHE programme, we teach the children about safety and how to recognise the "danger-signs" of feeling unsafe. We make sure that all children know and can talk about the people in school they can turn to if they feel unsafe.

History of Hayward's

Hayward's School has served the local community in the rural town of Crediton since 1860, when it was first opened in the old buildings next to the present school site. The school moved to its present location in 1937, and in 2003 benefited from a wonderful rebuilding programme which resulted in the airy, welcoming and up-to-date accommodation we all now enjoy. Hayward's now has access to the old youth centre, where it is able to provide facilities for high-quality Music, DT and Art.







The Hayward's Code and Hayward's Heroes

Our five 'Hayward's Heroes' are child-friendly representations of our values and ethos. Each one stands for an area of the 'Hayward's Code', which is the cultural and value system (written by Hayward's children, staff and governors) that we explicitly teach our children so they can become more successful learners.



SAM - stands up for **Maturity**.

He says: "Make Good Choices'

Remember: We all have the right to be treated **fairly**, but we have the responsibility to be **trustworthy**.



MAX - stands up for **Perseverance**.

He says: 'Never give up!'

Remember: We all have the right to ask for help when we need it, but we have the responsibility to work hard and do our best.



LUCY - stands up for **Respect**.

She says: 'Treat others as you would like to be treated!'

Remember: We all have the right to feel safe, but we have the responsibility to look after each other.



AMY - stands up for **Honesty.**

She says: 'Stand up for what's right!'
Remember: We all have the right to be heard, but we have the responsibility to speak the truth.





JAKE - stands up for **Focus**.

He says: 'Take pride in what you do!'

Remember: We all have the right to engage in our learning, but we have the responsibility to let other people do the same.



These five key character values feature throughout our Hayward's Code which includes:

Sharing strong values

By the time they leave Hayward's, we want our children to be happy and confident about who they are, sharing a love of learning, and enjoying strong, supportive relationships with others.



Hero Days

At Hayward's we greatly value our Hero Days which happen once per term. They are an opportunity for children to work in their Hero teams, joining children from across other year groups. They take part in a range of activities linked to a particular hero and skill, with each day having a different theme. The teachers also join their hero teams for the day.

When you come to Hayward's you will be allocated to one of our teams: Max, Lucy, Sam, Amy or Jake. If you have a brother or sister already in school, you will be placed in the same hero team.

The Hero Day theme shown below was 'diversity'. The children took part in a whole host of activities devoted to celebrating our

uniqueness and differences. It is always a fun day for all.





A typical school day

School begins at 8:55 am. A typical day will start with registration followed by Wake'n'Shake – a daily physical activity to get the children ready for learning. This usually lasts for between 10-15 minutes.

The children will have daily English and Maths sessions which usually happen in the morning. They may work within groups during these sessions, supported by their class teacher or a skilled teaching assistant. Years 1 to 6 have a mid-morning break of 15 minutes, during which time they may eat a snack.

The children have a one hour lunch break. During this time, they have the opportunity to play outside (weather permitting) on the playground or the school field. They eat lunch in the dinner hall with children in the same year groups going in together. Your child can choose to bring a packed lunch or order a school meal each day. All meals are cooked on site. All children in Reception and KS1 are entitled to free school meals. The Year 5 and 6 children have their own area where they have lunch. A self-serve system will be introduced During the afternoons, the children are usually taught foundation or topic based subjects. This could be specialist teaching for music or PE, history, geography or science. School finishes at 3:30 pm.

An engaging curriculum

Hayward's offers a broad and balanced curriculum, where we aim to make learning experiences fun, memorable and engaging—we follow the National Curriculum for Primary

schools which sets out expectations for each year group or stage of education. The school is divided into 'units' – Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1, Lower Key Stage 2 and Upper Key Stage 2. Each unit within school plans together and has a termly theme. Subjects are taught through this theme so that learning is joined up and meaningful to the children.





At Hayward's, our approach to learning focuses on teachers evaluating children's needs. We plan lessons and interventions with the child's needs at the forefront of our thinking, helping to ensure great progress.

We are a school that values investment in our staff to ensure they have the right level of support, training, time and challenge to meet the needs of your child. We have specialist areas of the school where we are able to help children learn about cooking, DT, art and music.

Exciting Opportunities

We feel that it is important to give children experiences that they may not have the opportunity of outside school. In year 2, children have a sleepover in the school hall, giving many children their first experience of sleeping away from home. Two residential visits happen later during a child's time at Hayward's - our Year 4 children visit Pixie's Holt on Dartmoor and our Year 6 children spend a week at Kilve Court Outdoor Centre in Somerset. These are brilliant opportunities for the children to enjoy the outdoors, develop the important skills of perseverance, resilience and team work and most importantly to better know, and build relationships, with their friends and the staff at school.



Throughout the year, activities take place which are

linked to the wider curriculum. The school takes part in many musical events, including a Christmas Concert at the local church

and performing at the Great Hall at Exeter University. Music is an important part of the curriculum and we have an excellent Y5/Y6 choir.



Early Years at Hayward's

At Hayward's Primary School, we are extremely proud of our Foundation Stage Unit, which builds on children's pre-school and home experiences during their Reception year of school. The unit accommodates up to 60 children within a stimulating, free-flow environment where a balance of adult-led and child-initiated play experiences are the foundation to everyday learning and development.







We recognise the vital importance of high quality early experiences and learning, and continually see our Early Years Team develop their high quality

practice and provision to suit children's interests and needs, ensuring that all children develop into confident and creative independent learners, who can challenge and extend their own learning.

Our Early Years Team work closely together, led by two highly experienced Early Years teachers, and pride themselves on high aspirations for all children as well as building an informed, holistic picture of every unique child. Sport at Hayward's

Hayward's has a proud sporting tradition and it is something that we value greatly. As well as having a specialist PE teacher working in school, we provide opportunities throughout the week for the children to take on a variety of sports and after-school clubs. We work hard to find a sport that everyone can be successful in.





Sports Day happens every year and is always a great event. The children compete in their hero teams and the day is a fun experience for everyone.





Uniform

We expect all children to wear uniform. Uniform with school motifs is available from 'Mole Avon Town and Country Store' in Crediton. The school has a stock of 'sale rail' items, which are pre-worn items still in very good condition. These can be purchased from the school office, along with school book bags and sun hats.

GIRLS:

- Mid-grey skirts or pinafore dresses, or mid-grey/black trousers (no jogging bottoms, combat pants or track suits, please)
- Mid-grey/black short trousers (with no markings, patterns or stripes)
- White, black or grey socks or white, red or grey tights
- White/red polo shirt (with or without the school motif)
- Red sweatshirt, fleece or cardigan with or without the school motif
- A pair of sensible shoes or black trainers (No fashion shoes)
- A Summer dress (red and white gingham)



- Mid-grey/black trousers (no jogging bottoms, combat pants or track suits please)
- Mid-grey/black short trousers (with no markings, patterns or stripes)
- Grey or black socks
- White/red polo shirt (with or without the school motif)
- Red sweatshirt, fleece or cardigan with or without the school motif
- A pair of sensible shoes or black trainers

PE KIT:

- A pair of black/ navy blue shorts, a standard white T-shirt with plimsolls or trainers.
- Tracksuit for outside PE in cold weather









PE kit must be kept in school in a PE bag. Kit will be sent home regularly for washing and checking.

We discourage children from wearing jewellery. Earrings must be studs only. All jewellery must be removed for PE and long hair must be tied back.

On 'Hero Days', children should come into school wearing a coloured top or t-shirt to match their Hero Team.

The colours are as follows:

Jake - Red Sam - Green Max - Yellow Lucy - Purple Amy - Blue

Well-being, Behaviour and Safety

We recognise that at some point during your child's time at Hayward's they may need some social or emotional support. We have a clear whole school ethos for supporting children, with systems and structures in place to spot those in need of support and act accordingly. We have a long tradition of making a hugely positive impact in this area, for which we are very well respected.



We use an innovative range of strategies to support children, usually led by our Pastoral Team. This might include morning nurture groups so that the children start the day in a really positive way, Forest School, play therapy, our 'Let's Grow' courses or simply a named adult to touch base with regularly.

We see the education of your children as a close-link between home and school and are keen to work closely together. We also invest a lot of time to support families, and share what we do in school with our community. This year we have run the Solihull Approach parenting course and the Family SEAL programme. We work with the Children's Centre to offer support with school transition and have started a successful drop in 'coffee morning.' We also employ Harbour Families who offer more intensive support outside of the school day.

We have high standards of behaviour and, as a result, behaviour around school is very good. Children respect one another and concentrate well in lessons.

SEND

Hayward's is committed to offering an inclusive curriculum to ensure the best possible progress for all our pupils, whatever their needs. We aim to create an environment where there is support for the child and family, so that they can progress in their learning and develop in self-confidence.

Throughout each year, pupil progress is assessed and monitored and support will be put in place for children not managing to achieve or make adequate progress. Close communication happens between school and home at every stage. If a concern is raised, it may be appropriate to place the child on the Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) register. This may mean that they will receive additional support within the classroom, or as part of a small group focusing on particular skills as part of intervention groups. Additional support might be accessed through outside agencies. Any support provided will be documented on a provision map and details of the support will be shared with you.

We work closely with a range of outside agencies. These include: our school Nurse, Education and Family Support advisor, Speech and Language Therapists, Educational Psychologists, Behaviour Support, Occupational Therapists, Hearing and Visual Impairment Advisory Teachers and an English as an additional language (EAL) advisory teacher. Alongside supporting the school staff through training in specialist areas, they are a great support to families.

We are proud to have a highly skilled team of teaching assistants who support the children. They help ensure that every child in the school reaches their full potential. Many run intervention groups such as speech and language, Fun Fit and motor skills groups. We have a specialist Dyslexia teacher, Speech and Language Therapist and a Pastoral Support leader who runs Forest school. We have three THRIVE practitioners (who are able to support children with emotional and social difficulties). We run a Family SEAL (Social, Emotional Aspects of Learning) programme every year for our Year 4 parents which have been widely supported. We value the importance of listening to children and each morning run a number of nurture groups to help children settle into the school day. A range of clubs led by teaching assistants follows this at lunchtime to help children with issues around friendship.

Starting school in Foundation Stage

Hayward's offers excellent provision for Early Years pupils. Our Early Years area comprises two classrooms leading into its own indoor practical area and outdoor classroom. When your child starts in Foundation Stage you will be offered a home visit in September. You will be given a Welcome Pack containing a range of information about the school and the build up to starting school. There will be plenty of opportunity to ask questions and meet the teacher who will be responsible for various aspects of your child's education or development. The children usually then spend three days part-time in school, building up to full-time.

We should point out that children are not required, by law, to attend school until they are five years old and as parents you have the right to delay school entry until they reach the statutory age.

When you are offered a place for September you have the following options:

- 1. full-time admission to Reception;
- 2. part-time admission to Reception up to the statutory school age;
- 3. part-time attendance at a pre-school setting while deferring a place in Reception.

You may not take a part-time place in Reception AND a free part-time place in a pre-school setting. Neither can you take a free full-time place in a pre-school setting. You could arrange for additional pre-school hours but you would have to pay for them.

If you wish to defer admission, you must inform the headteacher. That place will be held open up to the start of the term after your child's fifth birthday within that academic year and will not be offered to another child. If you do not let the headteacher know and your child does not start on the date offered, the place may be withdrawn and offered to another child.



Moving from another school or in year admissions

If you are moving into the area and have children who are already of school age, all you have to do is contact <u>Devon County Council Admissions</u> on 0345 155 1019 as soon as possible. Any children transferring to us from other schools should live within the designated catchment area for Hayward's. We do have an agreed protocol with other schools in Crediton for admitting any pupils from outside our catchment area. If you live outside our catchment area but would like your child to attend our school, we will always hold a conversation with your most local school. Any families moving out of the area may keep their children here if they so wish.

Before and After School Provision

We are able to offer before and after school provision through our neighbour providers at Leapfrogs nursery. They run the 'Geckos' club solely for Hayward's Primary School Children. For information telephone 01363 776474

As a school we run and host a number of after school clubs. Some run by school staff are free of charge to Hayward's pupils - others run by outside providers will make a small charge.

The school runs clubs at different times throughout the year. These include Hayward's Harmonies choir, ICT/blogging club, Football, Tag Rugby, Girls Can, Ultimate Frisbee, Stepping Up, Shining Bright. A variety of lunchtime clubs run throughout the year supported by school staff.



Friends of Hayward's

When your child starts school at Hayward's you automatically become a member of our 'Friends'. The Friends of Hayward's are volunteers who do an amazing job. They are a group of willing parents and staff who organise fundraising events from which all proceeds are ploughed back into our school. The Friends of Hayward's have been influential in many developments around the school grounds, including the development of new play equipment, and are also currently working on developing the school grounds further.
