

## EYFS Home Learning Pick and Mix Challenges – Sheet 2

We would like you to **complete at least 5 challenges** and **provide evidence of these on Tapestry** so that we can see the wonderful learning you are doing at home! You can complete more if you wish. Mrs Hockin and Miss Sweetman will keep an eye on Tapestry and look forward to seeing your completed challenges.

<p>Make a model using any materials you have got at home. This could be lego, junk, sticks etc. What can you make? How did you make it? Was anything about making your model tricky and what did you do about it? Take a picture of your finished model. Can you write some sentences to go with it explaining what it is?</p>	<p>What is your favourite story book? Can you share it with a member of your family and take a picture of this. Can you talk about why it is your favourite book? You could do a simple book review by drawing the front cover, give it a star rating out of 5 stars (with 5 stars being an amazing book) and then writing some sentences about why it is your favourite.</p>	<p>Using 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p and 20p coins, can you find different ways of making 10p and 20p? How many ways can you find? You could draw around the coins and label them each time to show the different ways you have made 10p and 20p.</p>
<p>Using a computer or a tablet if you have one, can you type your name and two sentences about you. Take a picture of you typing and upload it to Tapestry!</p>	<p>Can you use your pairs of socks and show your understanding of counting in twos to 10 or 20? Can you go further than 20? Take a picture or video of this and put it on Tapestry for us to see.</p>	<p>We have been looking at lots of stories in our literacy sessions over the last term. Can you write your own short story? Pick a character, a place and a special object such as a key or a wand and then write a short story that has a beginning, a middle and an end. Don't forget to start your story with Once upon a time or One day like we have been practising in class.</p>
<p>Create a picture of someone in your family using pencils, felt tips, paint, chalks, collage materials etc. Can you use a few of these to create your picture? Take a picture of your art work and upload it to Tapestry.</p>	<p>Choose a member of your family and find out 5 things about them by asking them questions such as What is your favourite food etc. Write down these 5 facts in sentences if you can. You could ask every member of your household the same questions and compare the answers that you get!</p>	<p>Can you bake something with your mum or dad? Take photos as you go and put these on Tapestry. You could even write some instructions on how to make the thing that you bake.</p>
<p>Make a card or write a letter to Monty Monkey or Bella Bear. They are missing you all and would love to hear from you. You do not need to post your card or letter but if you take a picture of it and put it onto Tapestry, Mrs Hockin and Miss Sweetman will share these with Monty and Bella. Then you can keep the card or letter safe and then you can give it to them when we are back at school.</p>	<p>Spending some time with your family singing some of your favourite songs or nursery rhymes. If you would like to video them and share them on Tapestry, we would love to see them!</p>	<p>Using only 30 bricks, building blocks or something similar such as lego, each family member has to make a model. At the end, have a look at how different or similar they are. You could repeat the challenge and see just how many different models you can make.</p>
