- Standard Assessment Tests carried out in Y2 and Y6.
- In Y6 they are externally marked.
- Nationally set date, time and procedures.
- Will take place during the week beginning the 8th May.
- Mock SATs

- The purpose of SATs is to provide a snapshot of attainment at Y6 nationally.
- The expectation is that pupils will meet Age- related expectation for Year 6.
 Age-related expectation is demonstrated by scoring a standardised score of 100.
- SATs results will be reported alongside a teacher assessment for writing.

Supporting your child at home:

Read with your child at every opportunity and ask them questions about their reading. Ensure children are reading for a minimum or 30 minutes every day.

Encourage use of Times Tables Rock Stars at least three times a week to keep their multiplication facts fresh.

Work on their written methods – x, +, -. ÷ (calculation policy)

Revision guides will be available around Christmas to purchase at a reduced price or they are available to buy online.

To Earn Each Level

Children collect a person portfolio of evidence to show they have achieved something from the list of options for that hero.

Evidence might include: signed statements from Teachers, coaches or other relevant adults, certificates, pictures of action, examples of work or a personal statement from the child.

The child will then collect and complete an Presentation Pass. And present this with the evidence to the school council who will either approve the application or give it the status 'not there yet'.
