Thank you for supporting such a brilliant cause. With your support, we managed to raise £339 for Children in Need. Well done everybody!

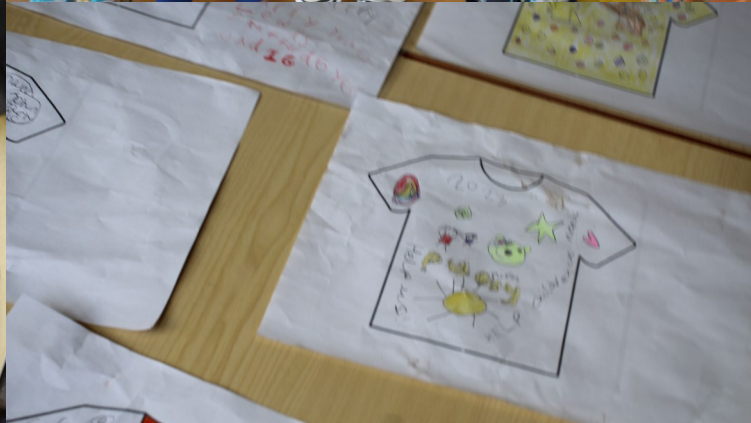


Children also took part in a 'Design the Merch' competition for Children in Need. Thank you to everybody who took part.

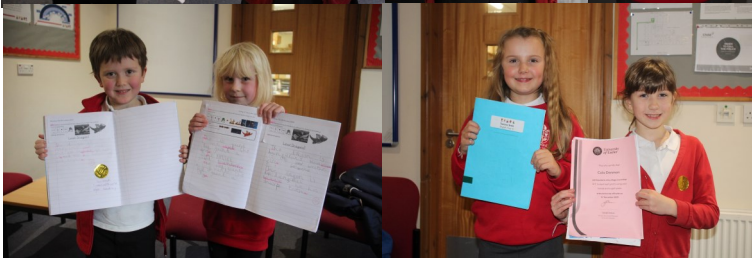

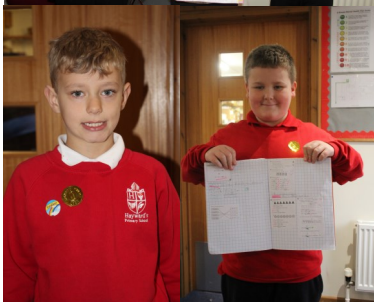
